Dear Ms. Zhou, Ms. Luo and Ms. Zhang,

The Harvard-Yenching Institute welcomes your continuing participation in its programs!

For the academic year 2015-16, your institution is invited to nominate up to a total of **five** (5) candidates (3 for the visiting scholars program and 2 for the visiting fellows program maximum) from among your most promising faculty and students for application to our programs. In conjunction with the mission of the Harvard-Yenching Institute, nominated scholars must be working in the humanities and social sciences with an emphasis on culture. We seek outstanding scholars whose work is academic rather than applied. Scholars whose research focus is comparative, and includes one or more Asian countries, are especially welcome. We will continue the centralized interview process that was put in place a few years ago. In addition, we would like to remind you that although there is no age limit for applicants, preference is given to younger scholars who are in the early stages of their academic career. We would greatly appreciate your posting the Harvard-Yenching Institute fellowship program information on your university web site for wide circulation.

The following is a summary of our programs:

Visiting Scholars Program

This program offers **faculty members in the humanities and social sciences** the opportunity to undertake 10 months of study and research at Harvard University and/or other appropriate universities. Approximately 10 to 15 applicants are chosen each year as researchers at the Harvard-Yenching Institute, and have access to the Harvard University libraries and facilities. Scholars are provided with living expenses while at the Institute. Applicants and university/academy administrators will be notified of selection results in mid-February, 2015. The selection criteria include English proficiency, academic training (including PhD degree in most cases), quality and originality of the research proposal, demonstrated depth of subject knowledge, and feasibility of conducting the research at Harvard University and/or other major universities in the United States. Selected scholars work with faculty at Harvard and/or other appropriate universities, and are required to make at least one public presentation in English on their proposed research project during their stay at the Institute.

The deadline for receipt of applications is **September 30, 2014**.

Visiting Fellows Program

This program provides **advanced Ph.D. candidates** (graduate students and junior faculty members) an opportunity to do dissertation research at Harvard University for three semesters, with access to Harvard University libraries and facilities. Fellows are also

affiliated with the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences of Harvard University, and provided with living expenses while at the Institute. All applicants and university/academy administrators will be notified of selection results in mid-February, 2015. In our selection process, preference is given to advanced Ph.D. candidates working in East Asian Studies, especially with a comparative focus. The selection criteria include academic training, quality and originality of the research proposal, depth of subject knowledge and feasibility of conducting the research at Harvard University. Selected fellows study under the supervision of faculty at Harvard or other appropriate university, and participate in a weekly dissertation workshop. Please note that junior faculty members who have already obtained a doctorate are NOT eligible for this program.

The deadline for receipt of applications is **September 30, 2014**.

We are pleased to announce a new change to the fellowship application process, which we hope will be more convenient for both your office and your nominated candidates. Beginning this year, **nominated candidates will apply online**. The Institute still requires all candidates to be officially nominated by their home institutions. Further instructions about the new online application system are included in the attachment [About the new online system.PDF]. Please note: you should feel free to continue using the attached application form and relevant information, and ask interested applicants to submit a hard copy of application for the internal nomination process within your institution.

The Institute has recently compiled a list of helpful information for fellowship applications (including information on eligible fields and selection criteria, the research proposal, recommendation letters, interviews, and the application review process). Please note that the Institute cannot accept the applications if there are more than **five** (5) candidates nominated. Please also be aware that no more than 3 candidates can be nominated to the visiting scholars program and no more than 2 candidates to the visiting fellows program. The Institute does not accept individual applications for the above programs. Scholarship applications sent directly to the Institute without official approval by an authorized nominating institution will not be considered. APPENDIX

1. Eligibility:

Visiting Scholars Program candidates should have been serving at their home university for at least two years (before August 1, 2013) as a full time faculty. Scholars who gained their PhD in an English speaking institution in the past five years (after August 1, 2010) are not eligible for applying for this program.

Visiting Fellows Program candidates should be doctoral students or junior faculty who are currently working on their dissertation research and writing. Junior faculty members who have already obtained a doctorate are NOT eligible to be nominated for this program. This program is only open to citizens of Asian countries.

2. Coverage of the scholarships:

The following is the detailed information on the fellowship coverage:

 A stipend of US \$5,665.00 per month (for 2014-15) for the period of residence in Cambridge, Massachusetts (for 10 months); Health Insurance; Funding (up to \$1,000) for hiring a research Assistant within the 10-month research stay; Funding (up to \$500) for one-time participation in an academic conference within the USA and Canada. 	 Payment of the Harvard University Visiting Fellows fee; A stipend adequate for a single fellow (for 2014-15, the monthly stipend is approximately \$2,700.00); Tuition for one English course for one semester at Harvard Extension School (not for a summer school course); Funding (up to \$500) for one-time participation in an academic conference within the USA and Canada.

3. Fields of Research

Candidates' fields of research in the humanities and social sciences to be considered:

- Anthropology
- Archaeology
- History (including art history, economic history and legal history)
- Linguistics

- Literature
- Philosophy
- Politics
- Study of Religion
- Sociology

Scholars in the fields of Economics, Law, Education and Psychology may be considered, but need to check with the Institute before submitting applications. If the research field of any of your candidates falls out of the range mentioned above (e.g. economics, law), and you are not sure if the candidate is eligible for the program, please contact Lindsay Strogatz at cprograms@harvard-yenching.org before you submit your application.
